Always striving to expand his role as a performer, **Kevin Harris** has built a career around deeper audience connection, wider collaboration, and delving deeper into unfamiliar musical territory. As a freelance bassoonist, he performs regularly across Southern Ontario and the GTA in nearly every established orchestra, including the

Toronto Symphony, the National Ballet, the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, and the Niagara Symphony.

Based in Toronto, Kevin is a member of two ambitious woodwind quintets: Quintagious and Blythwood Winds, each of whom are known for their innovative projects and engaging concert experiences. He contributes a variety of musical arrangements and transcriptions, and many hours of research to help these ensembles achieve their goals of building a broad and inclusive repertoire. In addition to his woodwind quintet transcriptions, Kevin has undertaken the work of producing editions of previously unpublished bassoon concerti by Canadian composers Jean Coulthard and Imant Raminsh.

As a studio musician Kevin has had the opportunity to lend his skills to a number of exciting projects in film, television, and video game soundtracks. Recently, he contributed to "The Ugly Chickens," a short film produced by famed novelist and screenwriter George R.R. Martin, and scored by Canadian composer Agatha Kaspar. Other soundtrack credits include the hit video game "Cuphead," composed by Toronto musician Kris Maddigan. Kevin can also be heard on the 2023 album "Lignum et Spiritus" by composer Robert Lemay, featuring works for solo woodwinds and piano.

Kevin is an Edmonton, Alberta native, and he moved to Toronto to attend the Glenn Gould School of The Royal Conservatory, where he studied with Fraser Jackson and Nadina Mackie Jackson, receiving his Performance Diploma in 2013 and Artist Diploma in 2015.



As a freelance clarinetist, **Anthony Thompson** performs
with many Toronto-based
ensembles. As an orchestral
musician, Anthony has appeared
with the Toronto Symphony
Orchestra, the Canadian Opera
Company, and the Esprit Orchestra.
Anthony has a deep passion for

contemporary music, performing regularly with many of Canada's premier new music ensembles. He has toured across Canada and parts of Asia with Soundstreams, Continuum Contemporary Music, and the Thin Edge New Music Collective. In addition to his performance career, Anthony has a large private teaching studio. Away from the clarinet, he enjoys spending time with his family, rock climbing, and triathlon training.



Tim Crouch is a highly motivated and energetic arts and culture administrator and flutist, with experience in marketing, sales, communications, and general management of both large and small classical music organizations. He is passionate about problemsolving issues facing arts and

culture organizations in Canadian communities, and creating structures and processes to make visions become a reality. He also believes in instilling a sense of entrepreneurialism in all artists. His past and current work has been with organizations of all sizes, including Tafelmusik, Soundstreams, Musicworks Magazine, the JUNOs, Orchestras Canada, Bloor Street Culture Corridor, Loose Tea Music Theatre, Toronto Bach Festival, the Kawartha Art Gallery, and the Kawartha Lakes Arts Council. He holds a Masters in Flute Performance from the University of Toronto, and his favourite place to be is reading a good book on a dock.

The **Odin Quartet** was established in 2015. At its core, the quartet is a testament to the diverse talents and backgrounds of its members. Alex Toskov, a virtuoso violinist and multi-instrumentalist, brings forth his Serbian heritage and musical depth from Belgrade, Serbia. Tanya Charles, an accomplished violinist and dedicated educator, channels her heritage from Saint Vincent and the Grenadines into her performances, infusing them with passion and cultural resonance. Matthew Antal, a violist with a keen ear for audio engineering, blends his Italian and Hungarian heritage seamlessly into the quartet's fabric, adding technical finesse and musical sensitivity. Samuel Bisson, a cellist and accomplished composer of French Canadian descent, revitalizes the ensemble with his unique artistic vision and profound understanding of the cello's voice.

Their performances have graced renowned festivals and concert series including Music Toronto, Music Niagara, Luminato Festival, Guelph Connections, Les Concerts Ponticello and Ottawa Valley Music Festival.

During the challenging times of the pandemic, the Odin Quartet launched a project called "Lockdown Lullabies", commissioning 28 original compositions from composers worldwide.

Since 2018, the quartet has proudly served as the Ensemble-in-Residence for the Scarborough Philharmonic Orchestra, and has released two albums, "Journey Through Night" (2021) and "Between the Lines" (2023). Additionally, their featured appearances on albums such as "From Oblivion to Hope" by Frank Horvat, "Jamaican Quartets" by Ted Runcie, and "Happy Alchemy" by Shannon Graham.

ELIXIR BAROQUE ENSEMBLE

THE EVOLUTION OF THE TRIO SONATA

Join **Elixir Baroque** on an exploration of the development of the Trio Sonata form. This incredible, mostly extinct musical form, was heavily popular in the Baroque Era. While its name may invoke a performance by three musicians, the trio sonata is written for four players. At times this includes four separate parts, but often has only has three written outlines, consisting of two melodic parts, and one continuo part. Elixir will perform music by A. Corelli, C. P. E. Bach, J. F. Rebel, Purcell, Buxtehude and more.

Since their foundation in 2010, Elixir Ensemble has strived to bring new life to music by serving up intoxicating programs that combine the lyrical with the virtuosic, and the well-known with the newly discovered. Elixir is a major proponent of historical performance practice in the Greater Toronto Area. As mentors to the younger generation of players, Elixir hopes to instil in young minds a curiosity for gut strings, pointy bows, harpsichords, and history. After being named one of the five finalists in the Early Music America Baroque Performance Competition, Elixir went through some updates and additions to their personnel, and has also operated as a historically informed string quartet, most recently participating in the Evolution of the String Quartet program in Banff, Alberta.

Blythwood Winds is one of Toronto's most sought-after wind ensembles. Founded in 2010, the quintet plays at many of the city's musical venues. Deeply committed to the performance of Canadian music, the quintet produces annual concerts of all Canadian programs, featuring world premieres from Canadian composers. Starting in 2015, their concerts have featured world premieres by composers including William Rowson, Kevin Lau, Jason Doell, Elisha Denburg, Bekah Simms, Anna Höstman, Emilie LeBel, and Patrick McGraw.

In 2015, the group was also featured on the Junofest Classical Nominees Showcase presented by CBC Music and the CMC. Blythwood Winds has a fruitful relationship with the Canadian Music Centre. As well as concerts of Canadian music, the quintet has also been involved with the CMC's OPUS Testing, a co-presentation with Musica Reflecta in which they premiered pieces for wind quintet and narrator. Blythwood Winds has recordings on the CMC's digital audio archive Centrestreams, and has plans to release an album on Centrediscs featuring a selection of their new repertoire in the near future.

A founding member of Wind Quintet International, they were a part of a 2018 nation-wide project showcasing commissions from five composers (Carmen Brayden, Cris Derksen, Emily Doolittle, Daniel Janke, and Cameron Wilson) in collaboration with five quintets active in other parts of Canada. Blythwood is also passionate about sharing music with all audiences, performing arrangements of different musical genres in fun, casual venues like pubs.


